



The 2010 Skate Canada: Alberta-NWT/Nunavut Adult Skating Awards

Creating the Edge for Life Award (age 18-24)

This award will be presented to one individual at the Skate Canada: Alberta-NWT/Nunavut Awards Banquet. Award recipients will be decided by the Section Awards Selection Committee.

This is an achievement award, to be presented to the younger adult skater that:

- passes tests through Skate Canada between the ages of 18 to 24 years
- and/or enters adult competitions at a local, national and /or international level
- and/or performs in skating productions
- is 18-24 years of age

This skater pushes themselves towards new goals, continues to challenge their ability and raises the standard in adult skating. This adult also displays good sportsmanship and also inspires skaters of all ages and levels to continue developing their own skating abilities.

Specific information such as tests passed, date and location of the tests, competition results including the date and name of the competition, specific information about other skating performances must be submitted with the application.

Criteria:

- The skater must be 18 years of age or older as of the deadline date for the awards nominations.
- Currently registered member of Skate Canada in the Adult STARSkate, Adult CanSkate or Adult PowerSkate programs.
- Male or Female
- Skaters are primarily skating in singles (Freeskate, interpretive etc.), dance (solo or couples) and pairs.
- The competition results are based on the past calendar year. For example the awards being presented in the spring of 2010 will use results from 2009.
- Test results include tests passed as an adult skater.
- Competitive Skaters over the age of 35 are also eligible to apply (as long as they meet the other requirements.)
- Skater must reside in Alberta, NWT or Nunavut, and be a member of a Skate Canada: Alberta-NWT/Nunavut Club.
